Background & Purpose

Ralston-Purina has commissioned Yankelovich Partners to conduct a survey among dog and cat owners on their attitudes toward and experiences with pet health in order to set a Pet Health Agenda for the 21st century.

The following topics were explored:

- ❖ The owner's relationship and daily life with their pet
- The benefits and challenges of pet ownership
- ❖ The pet's behavior and training of the pet
- The pet's health and well-being
- Sources of information on pet health and well-being

The results of this survey provide a "snapshot" of pet owners' experiences and attitudes in the year 2000, pinpointing areas of satisfaction and areas of concern for pet owners.

Methodology

Telephone interviews were conducted among 2,001 owners of dogs and cats. A total of 1,001 dog owners and 1,000 cat owners were interviewed. Interviews were conducted between August 3 and August 23, 2000 and were approximately 15 minutes in length. All participants were contacted via random digit dialing to ensure a representative sample of pet owners nationwide.

Participants were screened for the following criteria:

- Own at least one dog or cat, but not more than three pets combined.
- ❖ Individuals employed by pet product companies, or by an ad agency, public relations or market research firm were excluded. Breeders of dogs or cats were excluded as well.

Participants were asked to answer questions about one specific dog or cat only.

The margin of error for the entire sample of 2,001 pet owners is \pm 2.2%.



Pet Owners Find Companionship In Owning A Dog Or Cat

- ❖ The majority of dog owners (68%) and cat owners (61%) say companionship is the greatest benefit of owning their pet.
- Evidence of this companionship is apparent among both dog and cat owners.
 - Among dog owners...
 - 95% pet and hug their dog daily,
 - 92% play with their dog daily,
 - 45% have taken their dog on vacation, and
 - 43% have celebrated their dog's birthday.
 - Among cat owners...
 - 91% pet and hug their cat daily,
 - 85% play with their cat daily,
 - 29% have celebrated their cat's birthday,
 - 23% have visited health care facilities or schools with their cat, and
 - 16% have taken their cat on vacation.

In Addition To The Benefits, There Are Challenges To Owning A Pet

- ❖ The top four challenges of owning a pet are the same for both dog and cat owners, but vary slightly in the number of pet owners who mention them.
 - Among dog owners...
 - Obedience training (15%) and maintaining their dog's health (15%) are the top two challenges.
 - Cleaning up after their dog and just having something to take care of are each mentioned by ten percent of dog owners.
 - Among cat owners...
 - Maintaining their cat's health (13%) and cleaning up after their cat (13%) are seen as the biggest challenges.
 - For seven percent of cat owners, having something to take care of is the biggest challenge.
 - Although at the top of the list for dog owners, only five percent of cat owners feel obedience training is their greatest challenge.
- ❖ As would be expected, significantly more pet owners with younger pets say the greatest challenge of owning a pet is obedience training.



Pet Owners Who Have Children At Home Face Different Challenges And Pay Somewhat Less Attention To Their Pet

- Compared to pet owners without children at home...
 - More pet owners with children under 18 at home own both cats and dogs (25% vs. 16%).
 - More pet owners with children under 18 at home own younger pets (under 7 years of age) (73% vs. 58%).
 - Fewer pet owners with children under 18 at home groom their pet daily (79% vs. 27%).
 - Fewer pet owners with children under 18 at home celebrate their pets birthday (33% vs. 38%), take their pet on vacation (28% vs. 33%), or to stores, restaurants, and bars (8% vs. 11%).



Veterinarians Are By Far The Source Both Dog And Cat Owners Turn To The Most For Information About Their Pet

- ❖ More than seven out of ten dog owners (78%) and cat owners (71%) turn to a veterinarian most often for information about their pet.
 - Other sources, such as the Internet, books, and friends or family members are each turned to by fewer than seven percent of both cat and dog owners alike.
 - However, the number of pet owners who use the Internet to get information is higher among younger pet owners. Nine percent of pet owners age 18 to 34 turn to the Internet for information about their pet.

On Average Dog Owners Have Made More Visits To The Veterinarian In The Past Year

- ❖ Dog owners have made an average of 2.3 visits to the veterinarian in the past year, while cat owners have made an average of 1.6 visits.
- On average, pet owners age 18 to 35 and pet owners without children have taken their pet to the veterinarian more often in the past year (2.2 and 2.0 respectively).



Behavior Problems Exist, But Overall, Pet Owners Say Their Pets Are Well-behaved

- ❖ Among dog owners...
 - The top three behavior problems experienced with their dog are barking and growling (17%), jumping on people (13%), and begging for food (11%).
 - However, nearly all dog owners (97%) say that overall, their dog is well-behaved.
 - This includes three out of five dog owners (60%) who say their dog is very well behaved.
 - In fact, fewer than one out of five dog owners (19%) have taken their dog to obedience training.

Among cat owners...

- The top three behavior problems experienced with their cat are clawing the furniture (20%), climbing on furniture or counters (16%), and eliminating in the house outside the litter box (10%).
- However, like dog owners, nearly all cat owners (97%) say that overall, their cat is well-behaved.
 - This includes seven out of ten cat owners (72%) who say their cat is very well behaved.



Cat And Dog Owners Have Similar Ways Of Handling Their Pet's Behavior Problem

- Disciplining or scolding their pet is the top method used by both dog and cat owners.
 - Over half of dog owners (51%) and more than one-third of cat owners (35%) handle their pet's problem in this manner.
 - Other methods received significantly fewer mentions. Only five percent of dog owners and eight percent of cat owners say they spank or swat their pet.
 - It is also worth noting that nearly one out of five dog owners (18%) and one-quarter of cat owners (24%) say they do nothing.

Not Many Pet Owners Have Fully Solved Their Pet's Problem

- Only one out of five dog owners (21%) and three out of ten cat owners (30%) have fully solved their pet's behavior problem.
 - For many dog owners (54%) and cat owners (42%) some progress has been made, but they are still working on a solution.



The Single Greatest Health Problem Pet Owners Have Experienced With Their Pet Varies

- Among dog owners...
 - Fleas and ticks (6%), ear infections (6%), and allergies (5%) are the top three most common problems.
 - Each of the other health problems were mentioned by four percent or fewer dog owners.
- Among cat owners...
 - Hairballs (6%), fleas and ticks (5%), and urinary tract infections (4%) are the top three most common problems.
 - Additionally, each of the other health problems were mentioned by three percent or fewer cat owners.

However. Many Pet Owners Use Similar Methods Of Treating Their Pet's Health Problem

❖ One-third of both dog owners (36%) and cat owners (34%) give their pet medicine, while slightly fewer dog owners (32%) and cat owners (26%) also take their pet to the veterinarian.



In Many Cases, The Pet's Health Problem Has Been Solved

- ❖ The majority of dog owners (57%) and cat owners (62%) say their pet's health problem has been fully solved.
 - More than one-quarter of dog owners (28%) and cat owners (27%) say some progress has been made, but they are still working on a solution.
 - Only fifteen percent of dog owners and eleven percent of cat owners say the problem still exists.

Some Pet Owners Have Considered Or Sought Alternative Health Remedies

- One-third of dog owners (33%) and over one-quarter of cat owners (26%) have either considered or sought nutritional supplements for their pet.
- ❖ More than one out of ten dog owners (17%) and cat owners (16%) have considered or sought a massage.
- ❖ The number of owners who have considered or sought nutritional supplements or massages for their pet is significantly higher for owners whose pet is age 13 or older.



Despite Health Problems, Overall, Dog And Cat Owners Give Their Pet A Clean Bill Of Health

- Among dog owners...
 - Nearly all (97%) describe their dog's overall health as good.
 - This includes more than four out of five dog owners (82%) who describe their dog's health as very good.
 - Additionally, two out of five dog owners (41%) say they have not experienced any health problems with their dog.
 - The majority of dog owners (80%) do not even think their dog has a weight problem.
- Among cat owners...
 - Nearly all (98%) describe their cat's health as good.
 - This includes more than four out of five cat owners (84%) who describe their cat's health as very good.
 - Additionally, nearly half of cat owners (46%) say they have not experienced any health problems with their cat.
 - The majority of cat owners (76%) also do not believe their cat has a weight problem.

When It Comes To Why Pet Owners Have Not Spayed Or Neutered Their Pet, Many Say They Have Just Not Bothered To Do It Yet

- One-third of dog owners (34%) and fifteen percent of cat owners have not had their pet spayed or neutered.
- ❖ The top reason given by both dog owners (30%) and cat owners (27%) is that they have simply not bothered to do it yet.
- Other reasons given by dog owners include...
 - wanting to breed their dog (21%) and
 - the dog being too young (13%).
- Other reasons given by cat owners include...
 - the cat being too young (20%) and
 - not being able to afford it (18%).



The Pet Overpopulation Problem Is An Important Issue To Many

- Reducing the pet overpopulation problem is, by far, the issue most important for both dog and cat owners.
 - Over half of dog owners (56%) and nearly two-thirds of cat owners (63%) rank this issue number one in importance to them.
 - The second most important issue for both dog owners (17%) and cat owners (13%) is promoting a more pet-friendly society.
 - Twelve percent of dog owners and ten percent of cat owners say increasing preventive healthcare for pets is the most important issue for them.
 - Finally, increasing funding for research to improve pet health is the most important issue for ten percent of dog owners and eight percent of cat owners.
- ❖ More pet owners without children consider promoting a more pet-friendly society as their most important issue (16% vs 13%), while more of those with children see increased funding for improved pet health as important (11% vs. 8%).




Detailed Findings "All Pet Owners" (Dog and Cat)



Currently Own Cats, Dogs, or Both

One out of five pet owners (20%) own both cat(s) and dog(s).


❖ However, the majority of pet owners (80%) own only one or the other.



Number of Pets

The majority of pet owners do not own multiple dogs or cats.


- ❖ Among dog owners, seven out of ten (70%) own only one dog.
- ❖ Among cat owners, two-thirds (66%) own only one cat.



Breed of Pet

Nearly two out of five pet owners (38%) own a pure-breed dog or cat.


❖ As would be expected, more dog owners own a pure-breed.



Age of Pet

The majority of pet owners (63%) own a dog or cat that is under the age of seven.


❖ This includes eleven percent of pet owners who own a dog or cat that is younger than one year old.





Gender of Pet


There is an equal distribution among pet owners of male and female pets.





Whether Pet Has Been Spayed or Neutered


Nearly one-quarter of pet owners (24%) have not spayed or neutered their pet.



Reason Pet Has Not Been Spayed or Neutered

The top reason cited by many pet owners (29%) for not having their pet spayed or neutered is that they have just not bothered to do it yet.

❖ However, some pet owners (16%) want to breed their pet and a similar number (15%) report that their pet is too young.






Where Owners Got Their Pet


More than two out of five pet owners (42%) got their pet from a family member, friend, or neighbor.

❖ Smaller percentages of pet owners report getting their pet from the animal shelter (15%), a breeder (15%), or finding them as a stray (14%).



Number of Years As a Pet Owner

Two-thirds of pet owners (67%) report that over the course of their lifetime they have been a pet owner for 20 years or more. This includes one-third (32%) who report being a pet owner for more than 35 years.



Issues Most Important to Pet Owners

Reducing the pet overpopulation problem is by far the issue most important to pet owners, as reported by three out of five pet owners (60%).

❖ A distant second, cited most important by fifteen percent of pet owners, is promoting a more pet friendly society.



Frequency of Exercising Pet / Taking Pet For a Walk

Nearly half of pet owners (47%) exercise their pet or take their pet for a walk daily. On the other hand, almost two out of five pet owners (38%) never exercise their pet or take their pet for a walk.

❖ This large contrast can be attributed to the different lifestyles of dogs and cats. As would be expected, more dog owners exercise their dog or take their dog for a walk daily, while more cat owners never do this.






Frequency of Grooming Pet

Pet owners vary in the frequency of grooming their pet.


❖ However, nearly two-thirds (63%) groom their pet either daily or weekly.






Frequency of Petting and Hugging Pet

Frequency of Playing with Pet


Nearly nine out of ten pet owners (89%) play with their dog or cat daily.

Among activities owners do with their pets, celebrating their pet's birthday is at the top of the list.

❖ Almost one-third of pet owners (31%) have taken their pet along on vacation.






Greatest Benefit of Owning a Pet

According to nearly two-thirds of pet owners (64%), companionship is the greatest benefit of owning a dog or cat.

❖ The unconditional love their pet gives was mentioned by more than one out of ten pet owners (11%).

What is the greatest benefit of owning your pet?






Greatest Challenge of Owning a Pet

Pet owners have different views on the greatest challenge of owning a pet.


❖ Each of the top three challenges reported were mentioned by only about one out of ten pet owners. These include maintaining a pet's health (14%), cleaning up after a pet (11%), and obedience training (10%).



Sources of Information Owners Turn to About Their Pet

Veterinarians are overwhelmingly the favored source of information among pet owners.

❖ Three-quarters of pet owners (75%) most often turn to a veterinarian for information about their dog or cat.




Behavior of Pet

Overall, nearly all pet owners (97%) say their dog or cat is well behaved.

❖ Very few pet owners (3%) say their pet is not well behaved.

Overall, would you say your pet is very well behaved, fairly well behaved, not very well behaved, or not very well behaved at all?






Whether Have Ever Removed a Pet from the Household

The majority of pet owners have not had a behavior problem with a dog or cat so severe that they removed the animal from their household.

❖ However, when pet owners do experience such severe behavior problems with their pet, it is usually with a dog (14% versus 5% of severe behavior problems with cats).

Behavior Problem That Caused Removal of Pet

Reasons for removing cats and dogs vary.

- ❖ Three out of ten pet owners (30%) have removed a dog from their household for biting people.
- One-third of pet owners (33%) have removed a cat from their household for eliminating in the house outside the litter box.



What Happened to the Last Pet That Was Removed

Among pet owners who have removed a dog or cat from the household, more than one-quarter (28%) have taken their pet to an animal shelter.

- ❖ One out of five pet owners (20%) have had the animal euthanized.
- ❖ Still others gave or sold the pet either to a friend (18%), a stranger (12%), or a family member (9%).




Pet Health

Pet's Overall Health

Nearly all pet owners (97%) describe their pet's overall health as at least fairly good. This includes an overwhelming majority of pet owners (83%) who describe their pet's health as very good.

How would you describe your pet's overall health -- would you say their health is very good, fairly good, not very good, or not at all good?






Number of Times Taken Pet to a Veterinarian

On average, pet owners take their dog or cat to a veterinarian close to two times a year.

❖ Notably, fourteen percent of pet owners have not taken their pet to the veterinarian at all in the past year.





Greatest Health Problem Experienced with Pet

Many pet owners have not experienced health problems with their dog or cat. However, for those who have, the problems vary.

- ❖ Although fleas and/or ticks, as well as ear infections, are cited as the top health problem experienced by dog owners, they were mentioned by only 6% of dog owners.
- ❖ Similarly, although hairballs are cited as the top health problem experienced by cat owners, it was only mentioned by 6% of cat owners.



Steps Taken to Address Health Problem

More than one-third of pet owners (35%) have given their dog or cat medicine to address their health problem.

❖ Three out of ten pet owners (29%) have taken their pet to a veterinarian.






Extent to Which Problem Has Been Solved

Over half of pet owners (59%) say their pet's health problem has been fully solved.

More than one-quarter of pet owners (28%) have made some progress on solving their pet's behavior problem, but are still working on a solution.

Whether Have Considered / Sought Alternative Health Remedies

Nearly three out of ten pet owners (29%) have considered or sought nutritional supplements as an alternative health remedy for their pet.


❖ It is also interesting to note that sixteen percent of pet owners have either considered or sought a massage for their dog or cat.



Number of Dogs Own


The majority of dog owners (69%) own only one dog.



Breed of Dog

Pure-breed dogs outnumber mixed-breed dogs.

❖ Three out of five dog owners (61%) own a pure-breed dog.






Age of Dog

Two-thirds of dog owners (67%) own a dog that is under seven years of age.


- ❖ One-quarter of dog owners (27%) own a dog age seven to twelve.
- ❖ Very few dog owners (6%) own a dog older than twelve.






Gender of Dog

The number of male dogs owned versus female dogs owned is evenly split (51% versus 49% respectively).



Whether Dog Has Been Spayed or Neutered

Although two-thirds of dog owners (66%) report their dog has been spayed or neutered, this leaves one-third of dog owners (34%) whose dog has not been spayed or neutered.






Reason Dog Has Not Been Spayed or Neutered

Among dog owners who have not had their dog spayed or neutered, three out of ten (30%) have simply not bothered to do it yet.

One out of five dog owners (21%) who have not had their dog spayed or neutered wants to breed their dog.






Where Owners Got Their Dog

❖ One-quarter of dog owners (25%) got their dog from a breeder.






Number of Years As a Dog Owner

Over the course of their lifetime, the majority of current dog owners report that they have been a dog owner for many years.


❖ Two-thirds of dog owners (67%) have been dog owners for twenty years or more, including thirty percent who have been dog owners for more than thirty-five years.

Reducing the pet overpopulation problem is the issue most important to over half of dog owners (56%).


Promoting a more pet-friendly society is most important to seventeen percent of dog owners.

❖ Two out of five dog owners (19%) do this weekly.






Frequency of Grooming Dog

Almost all dog owners report grooming their dog, if only monthly.


- ❖ Nearly half of dog owners (45%) groom their dog weekly.

Frequency of Petting and Hugging Dog


Almost all dog owners (95%) take time each day to pet and hug their dog.

❖ Nine out of ten dog owners (92%) say they play with their dog daily.






Activities Pet Owners Do with Their Dog

Many dog owners include their dog in special activities.


- ❖ More than two out of five dog owners (45%) have taken their dog on vacation.

Greatest Challenge of Owning a Dog

❖ Each of these were mentioned by 15% of dog owners.



Other sources, such as books, the Internet, friends, and family members are turned to much less often by dog owners for information about their dog.






Dog Behavior

Overall, would you say your dog is very well behaved, fairly well behaved, not very well behaved, or not very well behaved at all?






Whether Have Taken Dog to Obedience Training

Not many dog owners have taken their dog to obedience training.


❖ Indeed, four out of five dog owners (81%) say they have not ever taken their dog to obedience training.



Greatest Behavior Problem Experienced with Dog

The single greatest behavior problem with their dog, experienced by nearly one out of five dog owners (17%), is barking and growling.


- Jumping on people ranked second as the single greatest behavior problem, mentioned by thirteen percent of dog owners.
- Begging for food (11%) was a close third.



Method of Handling Dog's Problem

Among dog owners who have experienced behavior problems with their dog, over half (51%) have disciplined or scolded their dog.


- Other methods of handling their dog's behavior problem were not as common among dog owners.
- Doing nothing to handle the dog's problem was mentioned by nearly one out of five (18%) dog owners.





Extent to Which Problem Has Been Solved

For most behavior problems experienced by dog owners with their dog (54%), some progress has been made, but a solution is still being worked on.


Dog Health

Dog's Overall Health

Overall, dog owners say their dog's health is good.

- ❖ In fact, the majority of dog owners (82%) say their dog's health is very good.
- ❖ Fifteen percent say their dog's health is fairly good.


How would you describe your dog's overall health -- would you say their health is very good, fairly good, not very good, or not at all good?

❖ This includes over half of dog owners (57%) who have taken their dog to the veterinarian more than once.






Greatest Health Problem Experienced with Dog

Two out of five dog owners (41%) say they have not experienced any health problems with their dog.


❖ The top three most common problems, although mentioned by only a small percentage of dog owners, are fleas and ticks (6%), ear infections (6%), and allergies (5%).

❖ An additional one-third (32%) have taken their dog to the veterinarian.



- ❖ Fifteen percent of dog owners are still experiencing the problem.



- Seventeen percent of dog owners have considered or sought out a massage for their dog.






Dog's Weight



Number of Cats Own


The majority of cat owners (66%) own only one cat.

❖ The majority of cat owners (79%) own a mixed-breed.






Age of Cat

Three out of five cat owners (60%) own a cat that is under seven years of age.


- ❖ One-quarter of cat owners (27%) own a cat age seven to twelve.

Gender of Cat


The number of male cats owned versus female cats owned is evenly split (49% versus 50% respectively).






Whether Cat Has Been Spayed or Neutered

More than four out of five cat owners (85%) have had their cat spayed or neutered.






Reason Cat Has Not Been Spayed or Neutered

- Eighteen percent of cat owners say they can not afford it.






Where Owners Got Their Cat

❖ Nearly one-quarter of cat owners (24%) found their cat as a stray.






Number of Years As a Pet Owner

Over the course of their lifetime, two-thirds of cat owners (67%) have been pet owners for more than twenty years.


❖ This includes one-third of cat owners (33%) who have owned a pet for 35 years or more over the course of their lifetime.

- ❖ Ten percent of cat owners feel it is important to increase preventive healthcare for pets.






Frequency of Exercising Cat / Taking Cat For a Walk



Almost all cat owners frequently pet and hug their cat.


❖ Nine out of ten cat owners (91%) pet and hug their cat daily.

- ❖ Eight percent of cat owners play with their cat weekly.






Activities Pet Owners Do with Their Cat

- ❖ Sixteen percent have taken their cat on vacation.






Greatest Benefit of Owning a Cat

❖ One out of ten cat owners (10%) says the greatest benefit of owning a cat is the unconditional love they give.






Greatest Challenge of Owning a Cat

Many cat owners differ in their opinion of the greatest challenge of owning a cat.


❖ Maintaining their cat's health (13%) and cleaning up after their cat (13%) were mentioned the most.

❖ Few cat owners turn to the Internet (6%), books (5%), or other sources for information about their cat.






Cat Behavior

Climbing on furniture and counters is the biggest behavior problem for sixteen percent of cat owners.



Among cat owners who have experienced a behavior problem with their cat, various methods are given for handling the problem.


❖ The method mentioned most often for handling their cat's behavior problem is disciplining or scolding the cat. This was mentioned by more than one-third (35%) of cat owners.

- ❖ One-quarter of cat owners (26%) say the problem still exists.







- ❖ Fourteen percent of cat owners say their cat's health is fairly good.


How would you describe your cat's overall health -- would you say their health is very good, fairly good, not very good, or not at all good?

❖ This includes nearly two out of five cat owners (38%) who have taken their cat to the veterinarian more than once.






Greatest Health Problem Experienced with Cat

The single greatest health problem cat owners have experienced with their cat varies from owner to owner.




❖ An additional one-quarter (26%) have taken their cat to the veterinarian.

- Eleven percent of cat owners say the problem still exists.




- One-quarter of cat owners (26%) have considered or sought nutritional supplements for their cat.
